# AFP Expands Its Geographic Reach

- Deepened efforts among more than 1,400 villages in 10 districts
- Added geographically challenging districts: Kapuas Hulu (border area) and Ambon City and Tual City (distant archipelagoes)
- Scaled up in 13 districts in West Kalimantan Province, 7 districts in West Nusa Tenggara Province, and 2 districts in East Java

*Through AFP and other collaborative investments, we are now reaching more than 50 districts in 6 provinces with evidence-based advocacy for family planning – up from 16 districts in 6 provinces in 2015*

# National and Local Government Commitment Is Proven

## National

- MoU between Ministry of Village Development and BKKBN developed to utilize village-level funds for family planning activities
- Accelerated integration of family planning into the national health insurance
- Incorporated AFP's advocacy approach into national government's advocacy strategy--in the process of forming a national family planning advocacy facilitators group

## Subnational

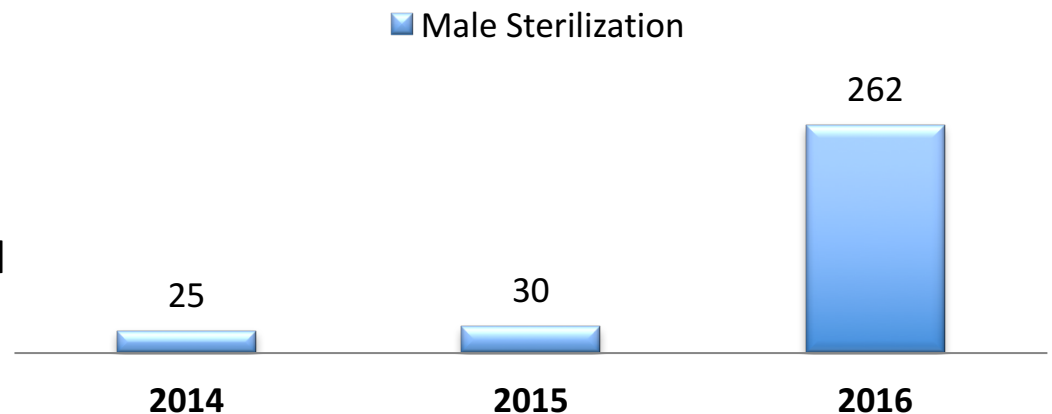
- Tual City allocated IDR 175,773,000 (US \$13,521) for training of 30 midwives and medical doctors in IUD and implant insertion in 2016
- Provincial leaders in East Java, West Kalimantan, Central Java, and West Nusa Tenggara have all made commitments to support and roll-out evidence-based advocacy efforts—totaling \$128,745 for 2017.

# FP Program Innovation in Indonesia

2014 → Mayor of Karanganyar provides a transport fee to male sterilization/vasectomy acceptors from his out-of-pocket funds

2016 → The Mayor has issued the Bupati Regulation No.11/2016 on time and travel compensations for vasectomy acceptors using the local district budget

**Number of vasectomy new users rose 8-fold from 2015 to 2016 in Karanganyar District**



Notes:

- IDR 1-1.5 million/person (US \$75-100) is used for transport fee and compensation for his lost paid work days.
- Promoting male sterilization through group counseling and testimony from the current male sterilization acceptors.

# Make AFP Contagious

- Support BKKBN implement evidence-based advocacy
  - from the ground-up and top-down
- Replicate district working groups that consist of multiple stakeholders to own and sustain advocacy activities
- Conduct an in-depth “impact” analysis in four districts to show the link between our advocacy efforts and local impact:
  - will incorporate data on method mix and use using SUSENAS as well as local records on budget allocations and expenditures, stock availability, service provision, etc.
