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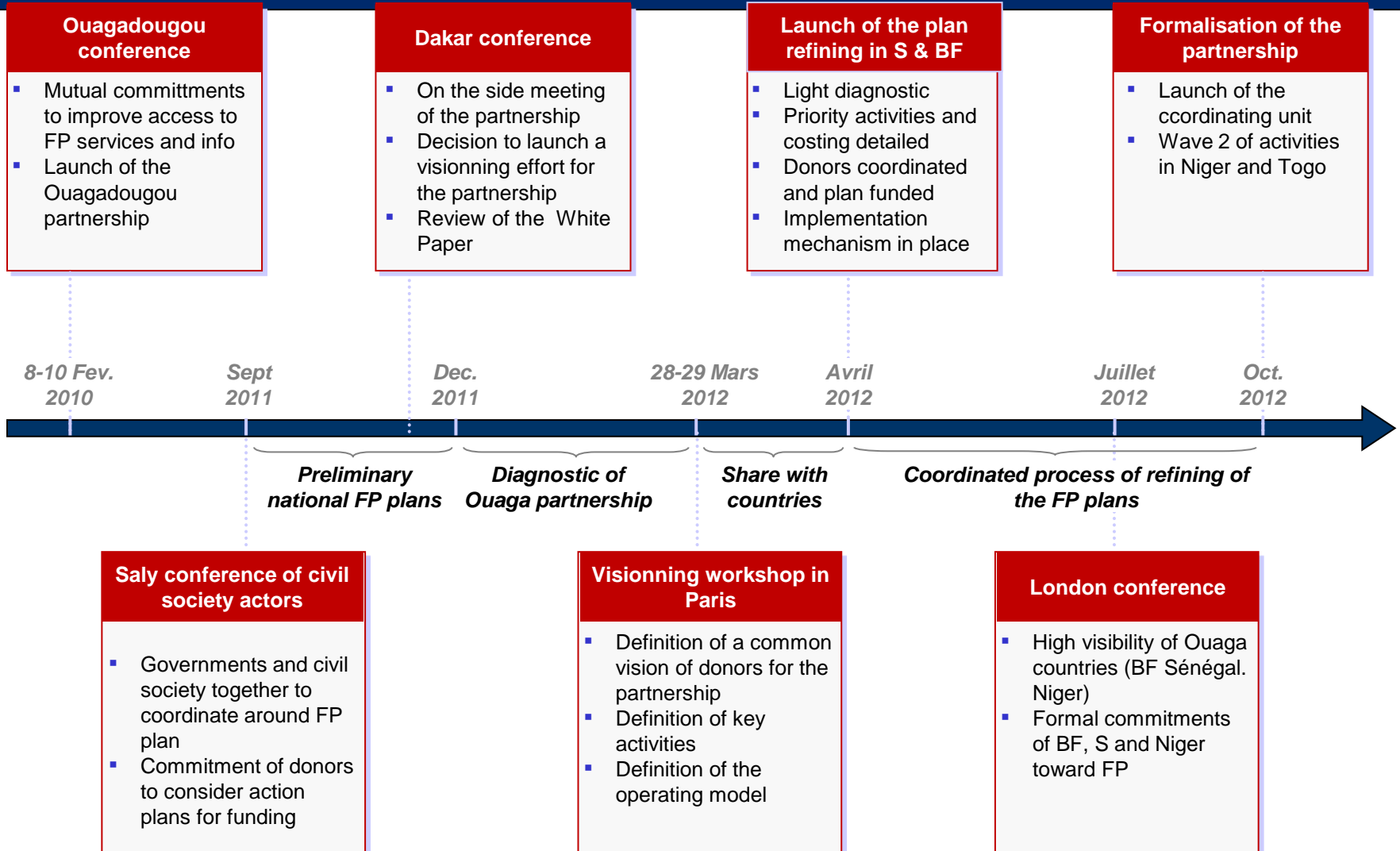

Vision for the partnership

■ Vision

- The donors will support the countries accelerate the achievement of their national goals for modern contraceptive prevalence rate and reach at least an additional 1 million women by 2015 in the region
- Countries: Benin, Burkina Faso, Guinea, Ivory Coast, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Senegal and Togo

■ Partners

- BMGF, Hewlett Foundation, USAID, Government of France
- UNFPA, WHO, KfW, WAHO, World Bank

■ Principles and values

- Increase political commitment and country ownership in implementation
- Highly leverage best practices in the region and balance with innovation
- Ensure equity by reaching to the poorest, youngest, and across geographies
- Ensure a broad method mix
- Build on the comparative advantages of different partners, Diversity of donors is a chance for the partnership
- Commit to transparency and accountability (e.g., frequent evaluation)
- Coordination and efficiency as main principles of partners' interactions



Donor commitments to support the partnership

- 1 The donors will support countries to strengthen their country action plans and prioritize a limited number of priority actions based on evidence and best practices
- 2 The donors will work amongst its members to define who is most able to support prioritized activities in the country action plans (in funding, implementation and monitoring),
- 3 The donors will help to mobilize additional funding for the country plans through FP2020
- 4 The donors will make sure that interfaces are clear with the governments and specific contact points are defined and that specific donor focal points are identified

Be fact based and focused on high impact

Be inclusive by involving all stakeholders

Be operational and focused on ease of implementation

National Plan as framework for all FP activities in the country

FP plan at regional levels

- Regional goals
- Regional activities depending of specificities

Innovative implementation mechanism and performance management scheme

- Dedicated resources in place at Ministry of Health
- Performance reviews by the minister of regional achievements and performance

Donors coordinated around a single plan with clear responsibilities
